Catch22 Surrey Young People's Substance Misuse Service is a county-wide treatment service for young people aged 11 to 21-years-old, with extra help for care leavers and those with learning difficulties up to the age of 25.

We work in partnership with you, offering:

- a crisis line
- counselling
- pharmacological support
- harm reduction approaches.

Young people will be allocated a dedicated support worker who will find out what problems they're facing, agree on the support needed, and stick with them right through to after-care.

Young people are at the centre of all we do. We ensure they know they will be listened to at all times. We work with young people at their pace, in an environment where they are comfortable – we don't expect them to travel to us.

How we help

Support includes:

- harm-reduction approach that informs young people about the effects of alcohol and drug misuse and the risks involved
- individually tailored help, based on an assessment of needs
- rapid response to prescribing needs
- access to needle exchange services
- specialist support for mental health problems
- counselling support
- whole-family work
- alternative therapies such as acupuncture
- access to mentors, after-care and recovery support
- transitional support to adult services
- additional support for care leavers and young people with learning difficulties or disabilities up to 25-years-old.
